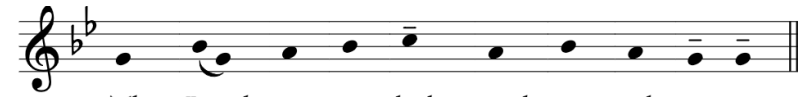

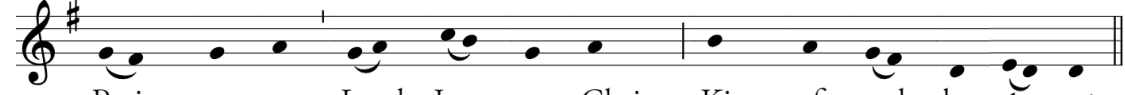

Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed
