FROM THE DESK OF FR. MARK Fr. Mark Guzman, Pastor

oday's readings remind us of a chief virtue that characterizes Christian discipleship: humility. This is a virtue that is widely thought of as a form of self-abasement. But that understanding is off the mark. Humility is simply the awareness of who (and Whose) we truly are.

On one hand we are children of the Most High God who loved us into existence; children whose Father sent His son to die for our sins, children who, by virtue of our Baptism, have the Holy Trinity dwelling within us. On the other hand, we are children who are completely dependent on God for our very existence and for every breath we take. The Christian disciple lives with an awareness of these two realities — our great dignity as sons and daughters of God, and our total dependence on Him for all that we are and all that we have been given.

Our First Reading, from Sirach, instructs, "What is too sublime for you, seek not, into things beyond your strength search not." As Christian stewards, aware of our total dependence on God, we must be content with "being little." We recognize that all that we have and all that we are Is unmerited gift from God. All bragging rights belong to Him, not us.

Our Lord speaks of true humility and the kind of outlook that goes along with it in our Gospel passage from Luke. While at a dinner party in the home of one of the leading Pharisees, Jesus observes the guests at the party jockeying for the most prestigious spots at the table,

He takes the opportunity to tell a parable (which sounds amazingly like the real-life situation that is happening at the very dinner party Christ is attending. Our Lord really has a wonderful sense of humor!) He says if you get invited to, say, a wedding banquet, not to take a place of honor at the table. He warns that a more distinguished guest might arrive and then embarrassment would ensue as you have to make your way to a less prestigious spot.

In sharing this parable, Jesus has in mind much more than an etiquette lesson. He is reminding us that all glory belongs to God. The visual image He offers in having to slink down to a lower seat at the table points out how silly we are when we forget to give God the credit for our blessings and talents. Jesus says, "Every one who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted." When we live in humility —recognizing that all we have is gift from God and using those gifts to serve Him and others, then God "exalts" us, by filling us with even more of Himself and His grace.

Jesus goes on to encourage us to actively seek to serve and share our blessings with people facing circumstances that would make it impossible for them to offer us any worldly advantage or prestige — people who are in poverty or have disabilities or infirmities of any kind. "When you hold a lunch or a dinner, do not invite your friends or your brothers or your relatives or your wealthy neighbors, in case they may invite you back and you have repayment.

Our attitude and the way in which we serve and share should be centered on true humility — recognizing that we are all "little" ones in the eyes of God. We are all His children; brothers and sisters invited to our Father's heavenly banquet.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Gregory the Great, Pope and Doctor of the Church

St. Gregory the Great (540-604) was a mayor, a monk, a pope, and a writer. Unhappy with his life as mayor of Rome, St. Gregory allocated half of his fortune to the poor and the other half to the foundation of seven monasteries. After joining a monastery in pursuit



of a simple life, he was elected to the papacy. As pope, he cared for the poor, implemented reforms to improve Church governance and clerical behavior, promoted the monastic vocation, and renewed the liturgy. His name is often associated with Gregorian chant (plainsong) and Eucharistic Prayer I (along with St. Hippolytus). A prolific writer and Doctor of the Church, St. Gregory composed numerous theological texts and is cited 374 times in St. Thomas Aquinas' *Summa Theologia*



The CENACLE: The name Cenacle comes from the Upper Room named after the Last Supper. People now gather together and form Cenacles or prayer groups throughout the world.

How was the Cenacle Prayer Group founded?

Our Cenacle was started 22 years ago with a group of women from St. Nicholas Parish who were interested in researching a book by a priest, Fr. Stephano Gobbi, who received locutions from the Blessed Mother of God. The book is called, <u>The Marian Movement of Priests</u>. Fr. Gobbi received these locutions in 1972 through 1997 when the book was published. At that time in the 70s and 80s, it was estimated that there were 300 Catholic bishops and 60,000 priests who believed in this movement. Over the years the messages have received the Imprimatur of many cardinals and archbishops.

At our last meeting, we read in Fr. Gobbi's book a locution about the need for these Cenacles or lights to be spread throughout the world. With our membership remaining steady throughout the years and with a few new members, we are excited to share our ministry in the bulletin.

What is the mission of the group?

This movement is an extension of Fatima message: The Marian Movement of Priest promotes the recitation of the Holy Rosary and consecration of our hearts to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The MMP is established in almost all of the countries of the world. One quote that helps explain the mission: The Blessed Mother says, "...There will be decisive events that will bring about the Triumph of My Immaculate Heart...I am asking you that Cenacles among priests, Cenacles among the faithful, and especially family Cenacles be multiplied even more, and even children Cenacles, a crusade of innocent prayer..." A summary says that this is a preparation time for the Second Pentecost for the Church and for all the world. The Holy Spirit will bring upon the earth His glorious reign, Gobbi died in June 2011 and the cause of his beatification will be opened soon. Fr. Gobbi had concelebrated Mass with Pope St. John Paull II in his private chapel at the Vatican.

Describe what a typical meeting looks like?

There are presently eight lay members of the MMP Cenacle. We usually meet in the hall or at a member' home on the 2nd Sunday of the month. The hostess serves a light lunch and then we begin our recitation of the Rosary, Chaplet of Mercy, Scripture, and set of prayers.

How have you seen the group make an impact on people's lives? Do you have any memories your would like to share? Member responses:

In the prayer group, there is friendship, comradery, and love for the members. One comes to the full realization that this not our eternal home, but in Heaven. This epiphany changes one's perspective on how to live a more spiritual life.

This group has lead me to a deeper regard for "to Jesus through Mary."

Our lives are spiritually enriched by being part of this Marian Cenacle. Every day we try to live out Mary's message of "Do whatever He tells you."

We have been together for so many years, with members who have come and gone, but we never leave behind what we have learned. We take our sharing and reading experiences back to our families and work places.
